Reflection

The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this post-resurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation. For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.

Child Safe Standards

Our parishes have a dedicated phone number for your use if you have any concerns regarding the safety of children or vulnerable people in our communities.

This number is 0478 850 754.

Always believe, and never doubt. If a child tells you they've experienced something that has made them feel unsafe, listen to them, believe them, and don't judge or pry for more information. With their permission, seek help from a professional. Reporting of child abuse is mandatory for anyone who is a registered medical practitioner, a nurse or midwife, a teacher, school principal, or police officer, but beholden on all of us.

The Archdiocese is committed to the safety, wellbeing and dignity of all children and vulnerable adults.

In an effort to utilise each of the facilities of the Parishes, for a trial period Mass will be Celebrated Mass each **Sunday at St Malachy's Blackwood at 4.00pm., beginning 9th June.** This trial period is to gauge if there is an interest in an afternoon Mass at the weekend in the Northern Deanery, as there is nothing at the moment. The invitation has been extended each of our neighbouring Parishes, some parts of Castlemaine and Bacchus Marsh parishes are very much closer to St Malachys, than Trentham or Kyneton. This is an opportunity not only to use St Malachy's for the celebration of Mass, but also to stimulate the ongoing use of St Malachy's. So even if it just for sheer curiosity put St Malachys on your to do list, but rug up, if you venture out there you will understand why.

ASRC—15th & 16th June

Asylum Seeker Resource Centre Food and Goods collection will be next weekend. Especially needed are: black tea in bags, healthy breakfast cereal, tinned fish in oil, coconut cream, basmati rice, tinned tomatoes, tinned chickpeas, shampoo, honey, pots & pans in good condition. This may be the only access to a grocery store that some Asylum Seekers have.

Cooks Who Care



This is a service offered through the Parish Centre with the assistance of a band of willing volunteers.

Based on a roster, our cooks deliver a prepared meal/s (freezer friendly) to the parish approximately twice a year. The meals are stored frozen and offered to families or individuals who may require a meal. And we have become so popular that the freezer is empty. So even if you are not on the Cooks Who Care Roster but have cooked a bit too much one night think about freezing it and bringing it to the Parish Centre. Little serves are good as usually the meals are given to one person households.

The up side is you don't look in your freezer in 3months time and wonder

what the hell to do with that "little" bit, give to us!

Please let us know if you aware of anyone who would appreciate this service.

AND if you would like to be part of this program and occasionally prepare a meal for someone in need then call the Parish Centre or Patrick on 0400 010 696.

Even if you do not wish to be a regular "cook" please feel welcome to bring in a meal occasionally if this suits you better.
