Reflection

Girls and boys, you have been waiting for today for a long time and now you are thrilled. Today is an important and special today for you and that is why we are all here for you. During these early years, you have helped them so much to know about God. For many years to come what you say and do will influence their faith and their friendship with Jesus and Mary. The faith you hand on will be their strength through life. You hand on your faith, you have no choice about that. The choice you have is to hand on your faith well. Your family needs faith in God. It is not something they need only when there is a crisis. Teachers and priests cannot plant faith in the heart of your children if you do not.

Today is a very happy day for everybody else here because relations, friends, teachers, people of the parish have all watched these children grow and helped them on their friendship with God. I know you are praying for them today and will continue to pray for them.

We hope you don't forget today, your First Holy Communion Day. Jesus wants you and your families to be happy today. Jesus wants to come into your heart because he loves you. Always remember that Jesus loves you.

We Care – Responding to the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act.

From the earliest times, Christ's followers have set themselves apart by their care of the vulnerable (Acts 4:34). On 19 June 2019, the *Voluntary Assisted Dying Act* (VAD) comes into effect. It legalises euthanasia and assisted suicide. Despite what the law may say, our Christian tradition affirms that every life, including those of the sick and suffering, is sacred. Euthanasia and assisted suicide are never part of end of life care. Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a “throw-away culture.” We are called to follow Christ by accompanying people with compassion, sharing hope not fear.

The Bishops of the Catholic dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst, echoing Pope Francis, have published a pastoral letter including practical guidance on ways we can be conscientious objectors to euthanasia.

Child Safe Standards

Our parishes have a dedicated phone number for your use if you have any concerns regarding the safety of children or vulnerable people in our communities.

This number is 0478 850 754.

Always believe, and never doubt. If a child tells you they've experienced something that has made them feel unsafe, listen to them, believe them, and don't judge or pry for more information. With their permission, seek help from a professional. Reporting of child abuse is mandatory for anyone who is a registered medical practitioner, a nurse or midwife, a teacher, school principal, or police officer, but beholden on all of us.

The Archdiocese is committed to the safety, wellbeing and dignity of all children and vulnerable adults.

Australia moves into the second phase of Plenary Council preparation

Six national themes for discernment announced

Discernment on the national themes will be key to informing and shaping the agenda for the Plenary Council meetings in 2020 and 2021. These themes have been drawn from the data gathered from 17,457 submissions (taken from over 220,000 people across the country). The six national themes for discernment seek to address how God is calling us to be a Christ-centred Church that is:

Missionary and evangelising

Inclusive, participatory and synodal

Prayerful and Eucharistic

Humble, healing and merciful

A joyful, hope-filled and servant community

Open to conversion and renewal.

National Theme for Discernment #2 –

How is God calling us to be a Christ-centred Church that is Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal? This National Theme for Discernment is inspired by the voices of the People of God who expressed a desire for individuals and groups within and also beyond the Church to find a better welcome and be incorporated more into her life and mission.
