Reflection

Jesus lived in a remote part of the Roman Empire where the majority eked out an existence. One of the few ways in which redistribution of wealth could occur was by voluntarily giving to the poor. So Jesus instructs his followers: 'Sell your possessions and give generously to those in need.'

We live in a very different society: 'The Commonwealth of Australia.'

'Common-wealth' indicates that the wealth of this nation, its people and resources, are meant to be directed to the common good.

So, we respond to Our Lord's command in ways very different to what was possible in his day. We have a compulsory taxation system which forces us to give up some of our possessions, some of our wealth to the common-wealth. Taxation and social justice policies help fulfil Our Lord's command to create a society more humane than anything remotely possible under the Roman Empire. And that would please Our Lord. Why?

In part because those in need are helped. But, perhaps in greater part, because it makes us larger hearted people. We have to arrive at the moment of death with a heart so capacious that it can include the billions of people we hope inhabit heavenly existence.

We might pause for a moment to pray for our hearts to be expanded by our contribution to the common-wealth of all peoples throughout the world.

Interested in the Catholic Faith?

Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith? Are you interested in becoming a Catholic? Are you interested in sharing your Catholic Faith with others? Our Combined Parishes' (Trentham & Kyneton) RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) team is about to begin a series to allow interested people to explore their faith. We are inviting anyone who has a 'yes' to any of the questions above to contact Fr Declan or the Parish Office 54221261 in order to establish suitable times. We know that an evening meeting during the week can be impossible for some, so we are trying to find a time that will fit with family and work life, and our RCIA team also have commitments.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (**RCIA**) is a process by which adults, whether Baptised or not, can make their way towards the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

These sessions can be for adults who have been Baptised a Catholic but not completed the other Sacraments and desire to. Also these sessions can be a great way to stimulate the renewed connection of our own faith and journey with God.

In 2019-2020 the RCIA will extend over four stages from late August 2019 to Easter in April 2020. It will involve open informal discussions, and more formally presented information.

Child Safe Standards

Always believe, and never doubt. If a child tells you they've experienced something that has made them feel unsafe, listen to them, believe them, and don't judge or pry for more information. With their permission, seek help from a professional. Reporting of child abuse is mandatory for anyone who is a registered medical practitioner, a nurse or midwife, a teacher, school principal, or police officer, but beholden on all of us. *The Archdiocese is committed to the safety, wellbeing and dignity of all children and vulnerable adults.*

Plenary Council 2020 -

Period of Communal Listening and Discernment

With the conclusion of the first stage of the Plenary Council process earlier this year, the Australian Catholic community is now being asked to enter a period of Communal Listening and Discernment. In a short while, when the final of the six themes is released, a National Report will be published.

Hopefully, sometime in September, we will be able to begin a series of gatherings within the Parish, considering the six themes one by one, the thoughts which have come from the larger Catholic Community, to listen to our personal responses, and to reflect through prayer and discernment. This national process of discernment will lead into the report going to the Bishops and other Council participants, to be the focus of the actual Council deliberations in 2020.

"Within the Catholic Church in Australia at this time, the bishops have posed the question to the faithful, "What is God asking of us at this time?"
