Reflection

Hearing Our Lord's command: 'Invite the poor, the crippled, to the feast,' how do we respond as citizens of a nation which, in comparative global terms, is having a great feast? Jesus demands that we go well beyond an immigration policy which favours skilled and entrepreneurial people. They more than 'repay our courtesy' in terms of economic activity and social stability.

The majority of the poor and the crippled live in the subsistence villages, the refugee camps, and the squalor of the megacities of the Third World.

Heaven embossed invitations must be extended to such as those so that they may join in our national feast. Only then can we become the sort of people who, in the great Feast of Heaven, can join with those poor who are certain to be there.

We could pause for a moment to pray to put today's Gospel into effect so that we might hear Our Lord: 'Friend, join in the Feast. Be close to me.'

Priests Retirement Foundation—Special Collection

Sunday the 1st September is the traditional day for the annual collection for the Priests Retirement Foundation. The appeal creates one of the 4 main income streams for the Foundation enabling the support of retired Priests of the Archdiocese.

Some 40 years ago with the introduction of “new” canon law Archbishop Knox introduced the practice of Priests retiring at 75. Until then, Priests literally “died with their boots on” because elderly diocesan had nowhere to live, apart from their parish presbytery.

In 1990 Archbishop Little established the Priests Retirement Foundation with the motto “caring for those who cared”.

Priests have no Superannuation and their care in retirement depends somewhat on this Special Collection.

89 Melbourne Diocesan Priests are currently retired. 5 are in their 90s.

It is estimated that 6 Priests will retire each year for the next 6 years.

Most retired Priests have served for around 50 years in Parish Ministry.

A couple of our favourites are among those being cared for, and the poster boy this year is Fr Jack Brady who served this community well. Fr Brian McMahon and Fr Joe Hynan are both being cared for at Justin Villa. Your support is appreciated so very much, thank you. If you wish to contribute via Credit Card, Direct Deposit or Cheque, there are envelopes at the back of the Church, and donation this way attracts a receipt for taxation purposes.

Child Safe Standards

Our parishes have a dedicated phone number for your use if you have any concerns regarding the safety of children or vulnerable people in our communities.

This number is 0478 850 754.

Always believe, and never doubt. If a child tells you they've experienced something that has made them feel unsafe, listen to them, believe them, and don't judge or pry for more information. With their permission, seek help from a professional. Reporting of child abuse is mandatory for anyone who is a registered medical practitioner, a nurse or midwife, a teacher, school principal, or police officer, but beholden on all of us.

The Archdiocese is committed to the safety, wellbeing and dignity of all children and vulnerable adults.
